PROJECT LIFE SAVER

BRYAN COUNTY

Bryan County Project Lifesaver

Program Information: A rapid-response program designed to protect and locate missing persons, by placing personalized radio transmitters on eligible individuals who may wander away from the safety of their home. These transmitters assist caregivers and the Bryan County Sheriff's Department in locating those who are unable to help themselves.

Eligibility: Anyone who at risk of wandering from their homes, including, but not limited to, those with Alzheimer's, dementia, Autism, Down syndrome, traumatic brain injuries, and mental health disorders.

How it Works:

- The Personal Locator Unit (PLU) is a small, one-ounce battery-operated wrist or ankle transmitter. It continuously emits an individualized tracking signal every minute of every day.
- Should a program participant go missing, the caregiver immediately notifies 911, and a specially trained search and rescue team from the Bryan County Sheriff's Office responds to the area and begins the search.

Additional Program Information:

Georgia Autism Initiative

The Georgia Autism Initiative is the statewide coordination and delivery of services that improve capacity for early intervention, family coaching and support, transition planning, and provider training for infants and youth with ASD from birth to 21 years of age and their families.

Specifically, through this initiative:

- A network of licensed community psychologists and board-certified behavior analysts (BCBA) that provide diagnostic and behavioral intervention to improve outcomes of children and youth with ASD.
- Program staff collaborate with physicians and district coordinators to record and/or administer ASD specific screenings for early intervention.
- Family coaching and support is offered through the development of individualized plans and support services.

Program Referrals:

- Are required to be considered for program participation.

Program Information: A rapid-response program designed to protect and locate missing persons, by placing personalized radio transmitters on eligible individuals who may wander away from the safety of their home. These transmitters assist caregivers and the Bryan County Sheriff's Department in locating those who are unable to help themselves.

Eligibility: Anyone who at risk of wandering from their homes, including, but not limited to, those with Alzheimer's, dementia, Autism, Down syndrome, traumatic brain injuries, and mental health disorders.

How it Works:

- The Personal Locator Unit (PLU) is a small, one-ounce battery-operated wrist or ankle transmitter. It continuously emits an individualized tracking signal every minute of every day.
- Should a program participant go missing, the caregiver immediately notifies 911, and a specially trained search and rescue team from the Bryan County Sheriff's Office responds to the area and begins the search.

Senior Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

The Georgia Senior SNAP Program is a simplified application process designed to make it easier for Seniors to receive SNAP benefits.

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria to qualify for Senior SNAP benefits:

- All members of the household are 60 years of age or older.
- All members of the household purchase and prepare their food together.
- All members of the household are not working.
- The household is under the income limits to be eligible for SNAP participation.
- The household has a permanent fixed income such as Social Security Income, Private, State or Federal Retirement, Veterans Administration benefits or United States Railroad Retirement.

Those who qualify for Senior SNAP benefits are eligible for medical deductions when applying for SNAP benefits. Medical expenses exceeding \$35 per month can decrease an applicant's gross income, increasing the amount of SNAP benefits eligible for receipt. Medical expenses include expenses associated with the following:

- Medical and dental care
- Hospitalization, outpatient treatment, and nursing home care
- Prescription drugs and over-the-counter medications prescribed by a qualified medical provider
- Medical supplies and medical equipment prescribed by a qualified medical provider (including equipment rental costs)
- Eyeglasses, contact lenses, hearing aids, dentures and prosthetic devices prescribed by a qualified medical provider
- Health insurance and prescription drug insurance premiums
- Medicare and Medicare supplement premiums
- Transportation and lodging incurred during the receipt of medical treatment (e.g., trips to the healthcare providers, dentist, or pharmacy for prescriptions), including the cost of mileage, parking, bus fare, taxi fare, etc.
- Maintaining a homemaker, home health aide, child care services, or housekeeping services that are necessary because of age, health condition, or illness
- The cost of telephone equipment specially designed for a disabled person

When applying for Senior SNAP, list any applicable medical expenses and provide verification of those expenses (e.g., insurance statements, medical bills, receipts with prescriptions, etc.).

Social Security Death Benefits

Upon the death of a loved one, some family members may qualify for death benefits through Social Security. Eligible individuals may be eligible to receive one or both of the following:

- One-Time Lump Sum Payment of \$255:
 - Surviving spouse if he/she was living with the deceased.
 - If the surviving spouse was living apart from the deceased and eligible for certain Social Security benefits on the deceased's record, the surviving spouse may still be able to receive this one-time payment.
 - If there is no surviving spouse, a child who is eligible for benefits on the deceased's record in the month of the death.
- Monthly Benefits:
 - A widow or widower age 60 or older (age 50 or older if disabled).
 - A widow or widower of any age caring for the deceased's child who is under age 16 or disabled.
 - An unmarried child of the deceased who is either:
 - Younger than age 18 (or up to age 19 if they are a full-time student in an elementary or secondary school).
 - Age 18 or older with a disability that began before age 22.

- A step-child, grandchild, step-grandchild, or adopted child under certain circumstances.
- Parents, age 62 or older, who were dependent on the deceased for at least half of their support.
- A surviving divorced spouse, under certain circumstances.

The Georgia Autism Initiative is the statewide coordination and delivery of services that improve capacity for early intervention, family coaching and support, transition planning, and provider training for infants and youth with ASD from birth to 21 years of age and their families.

Specifically, through this initiative:

- A network of licensed community psychologists and board-certified behavior analysts (BCBA) that provide diagnostic and behavioral intervention to improve outcomes of children and youth with ASD.
- Program staff collaborate with physicians and district coordinators to record and/or administer ASD specific screenings for early intervention.

- Family coaching and support is offered through the development of individualized plans and support services.

Program Referrals:

- Are required to be considered for program participation.
- Anyone can refer children to the program if there are concerns about the child's growth and development and/or the child has been diagnosed with ASD.
- All referrals must first be received through the Children's 1st program.
